Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity

The Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity takes place from 18th – 25th January, and every year the Christian churches in Prescot hold a joint service to celebrate what we share in common. This year we are hosting the service on Sunday 18th January at 3pm. All are welcome to attend.

Lepra

Lepra is an international organisation which helps people who live with leprosy. The WHO categorises leprosy as a 'neglected tropical disease' (NTD) which still occurs in more than 120 countries, with more than 200 000 new cases reported every year. Lepra works across the world to improve early detection, ensure access to treatment and care and to promote inclusion and wellbeing. One project still supported by Lepra is St Joseph's Leprosy Centre (SJLC) in Madhya Pradesh, India, which has been providing holistic relief to people affected by leprosy since 1993. Services range from initial diagnosis screening through to self-care, ulcer treatment, and the provision of protective footwear.

Feast Days

Wednesday 21st - Memorial of St Agnes

One of the most famous and universally celebrated of the early Roman martyrs. She suffered martyrdom at Rome at the beginning of the 4th century, a young girl aged only about 13 who preferred death rather than the loss of her virginity. She also refused to offer incense to false gods. Pope Damasus embellished her tomb with sacred verses, and many of the Fathers, following the example of St Ambrose, spoke of her with great praise. Her name is included in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I, aka the proper one). A Happy Feast day to our friends and neighbours at St Agnes church, Huyton.

Saturday 24th - Memorial of St Francis de Sales

Born to a noble family at Chateau de Sales in the Kingdom of Savoy near Geneva, Switzerland in 1567. Francis was both intelligent and gentle. From a very early age, he desired to serve God. He knew for years he had a vocation to the priesthood. He became noted for his deep faith and his gentle approach to the religious divisions in his land resulting from the Protestant Reformation. He was a Bishop and Doctor of the Church. He is known also for his writings on the topic of spiritual direction and spiritual formation, particularly the Introduction to the Devout Life and the Treatise on the Love of God
